# 2022 Minnesota Student Survey

The Minnesota Student Survey (MSS) is one of the longest-running youth surveys in the nation. It is a triennial survey that began in 1989 and is administered to students in grades five, eight, nine, and 11. The survey is conducted statewide, to gain insights into the world of students and their experiences.





# 2022 Minnesota Student Survey

The 2022 MSS was administered in the first half of 2022 to students in grades five, eight, nine and 11 statewide. The survey was voluntary at all levels; districts, schools, parents, and students could all choose to opt out. **Most public school districts (70%)** chose to participate. Overall, participation across the four grades was approximately **51% of total enrollment**.

Total state-wide participation of the 2022 MSS Survey





## 2022 Minnesota Student Survey Results Emotional Well-Being and Distress



Females in 8th, 9th, and 11th grade are 2 to 3 times more at risk for:

- Reporting feeling down, depressed, or hopeless (more than 1 day) in the past 2 weeks
- Reporting they have long-term mental health, behavioral or emotional problems that lasted 6 months or more.

All HPH counties, there was a decrease from 8th grade to 11th grade in students reporting feeling good about myself.



- 11th Grade Adults Care Quite a Bit/Very Much





 On average 9th & 11th graders reported being LESS physically active by 10% (5+ days/week) since 2019.


#### Nutrition:

On average, 9th & 11th graders reported **LESS Cigarette use** since 2019. The MN average use for 9th & 11th graders is below 3%.




